# **BUDGET UPDATE**

On Tuesday the Finance Minister, Rebecca Evans MS, presented the latest stage of the draft budget to the Senedd. In it she reiterated the difficult position Wales finds itself in and responded to the work of the scrutiny committees since its announcement in December.

As Chair of the Children Young Person and Education Committee I highlighted how children and other vulnerable groups are disproportionately impacted by the cost-of-living crisis, there is lot of good in this budget but more can be done, particularly around extending Free School Meals in the school holidays and the EMA review. record.assembly.wales/Plenary/13218#C482960

# **IN THE SENEDD**

Pleased to host a debate this week on the Children, Young People and Education Committee's report on Pupil Absence. Broad trends indicate that attendance has decreased since the pandemic and continues to decrease. When we published the report in November, average attendance was 91.4%. As of the most recent data published 08/02, the average attendance had declined to 89.3%.

As a committee we made seven recommendations in total to address this issue, all of which were accepted, or accepted in principle, by the Welsh Government. You can find the full report here:

The debate was a positive one, showing a shared ambition to ensure children and young people are able to attend school and engage in school activity as much as possible.

This UK Parliament is set to be the worst Parliament on record for living standards. No uplift to Universal Credit, no childcare reforms, and energy support for individuals and small businesses are set to fall off a cliff in April. In January, I asked First Minister, Mark Drakeford, how the Welsh Government is tackling the cost-of-living crisis in Newport West.

Acknowledging that people across Wales, including in Newport West, are experiencing the largest and sharpest fall in living standards since records began, the First Minister advised of the plan to spend £1.6 billion on targeted cost of living support and universal programmes to tackle poverty and to leave money in people's pockets. The main lever is held by Westminster, but the Welsh Government will always prioritise protecting those hardest hit.
